Dear Mr. Heylin,

We spoke last week concerning an article, *Automakers Move Toward New Generation Of 'Greener' Vehicles*, in your August 1, 1994 issue.

There is some information that I wish to bring to your attention. One of the proposed PNGV goals, to achieve 80 MPG by 2002, is the same goal that a prior GM President predicted for 1939. Shell Oil achieved, in 1973, 376.59 MPG, this is 4.71 times the proposed PNGV 80 MPG. Many, decades old, U.S. and foreign patents exist for completely sealed reciprocating engines, gasoline engine devices that produce more than 100 MPG and devices that fuel an engine with the components of water. It appears to me, that a project similar to inventing the wheel is to be funded by the taxpayer and business.

There appears to be an effort by the media, government, environmental groups (One example; four letters, one certified, to the Ralph Nader groups, and a FAX attempt to go around the gate keepers.), The American Automobile Association, and private industry to suppress energy information. This information, if the public had knowledge of it, could greatly improve our standard of living. Since October 1990, when I began to keep records, the list of people that were contacted concerning energy information has grown to 37 pages. Most people don't respond, including "my own" Members of Congress, nor any of the "environmental" groups. Some copies of letters to people on the list are attached.

If you find the attached information of interest, please forward it to Ms. Illman. She may find it of use in a future article.
