Dear Speaker Pelosi,

Now that the Senate has passed the energy bill it is time for the House improve the bill to benefit the American people.

The lobbyist for the automobile industry will certainly bombard your office with reasons an automobile can not achieve 35-mpg. This is in contrast with easily verifiable facts that 35-mpg has already been surpassed and can be much higher. These documents are attached; a 1983 Peugeot advertisement for a 72-mpg automobile, a 2002 announcement for a 104-mpg Toyota and pages from a book written by Shell Oil personnel (The Shell document is on the back of the flyer distributed to those complaining about the cost of gasoline.). Shell achieved 149.95-mpg in 1949, 244.35-mpg in 1968 and 376-mpg in 1973.

During April 2006 a documentary CD, duplicating my web page www.byronwine.com, was sent to a home district office of every member of "The House Committee on Energy and Commerce". Not one member, including the staff of the committee, responded. I am forced to conclude that no one on the committee is interested in reducing energy consumption or reliance on foreign oil.

The CD included several videos of automobiles burning the components of water for fuel. This month I learned, from a Japanese newscast, a water-fueled vehicle is on the street in Japan, also Honda has a hydrogen fueled vehicle running in Japan. This technology is not new, it was demonstrated 200-years ago in an early automobile. Documentation for the above is on my web page. It appears our government is not interested in devices fueled with the components of water if it results in reducing energy company profits.

Speaker Pelosi, this retiree can not compete with the well-funded lobbyist for the energy and automotive interest in their effort to influence your office. I can only supply the truth and hope you consider all the facts.
